



## Snow (Rum) Balls Recipe

makes about 60
8 oz pecans
9 oz package chocolate or vanilla wafer cookies
1/2 cup powdered sugar
2 tbs cocoa powder
1/2 cup rum
2 tbs corn syrup
zest of 1 orange

colored sugar for decoration

In a food processor pulse pecans until finely ground. Add cookies and pulse until ground. Add remaining ingredients and pulse until thoroughly mixed. Roll mixture into small balls, then decorate by rolling colored sugars. Store in airtight container.

You can substitute different liqueurs (coffee, raspberry, etc.) for a great variety of tastes.
